

MINUTES OF THE 24th ANNUAL GENERAL MEETING HELD ON TUESDAY 21st FEBRUARY 2012 AT NORMANDY VILLAGE HALL.

1. The Vice Chairman Jack Kinder welcomed 54 members to the meeting.
2. The required number of Members [25] were therefore present to form a quorum.
3. Apologies were received from 3 members.

4. ANNUAL GENERAL MEETING – CONSTITUTIONAL REQUIREMENTS.

- 1] Minutes for the 2011 AGM adopted.
- 2] The Vice Chairman submitted the Annual Report.
- 3] The Auditors statement for the 2011 Accounts was adopted.
- 4] The Treasurer John Squier had prepared a Financial Statement for the year ending 2011.

Working Fund balance is £137.45. Publication Fund balance is £1,040.45.

Total in cash is £1,177.90. This statement was adopted. The Treasurer stated that it was our intention to raise the Subscription rate to £ 5 per member for 2013, and phase out the Family Rate.

- 5] The Membership Secretary reported that in 2011 Membership was 104 Individuals and 1 Family
- 6] The Calendar of Events and Speakers was presented to members.
- 7] The Auditor H.F. [Jim] Chisnall was appointed for next year.
- 8] The Vice Chairman proposes that Ken Marchant is re-elected as Chairman and the retiring Officers and members viz :- Jack Kinder, Diana Marchant, John Squier, Sandra Granger, Peter Trevaskis, Christopher Pettitt and Ros Clements be re-elected Adopted. Two vacancies advertised, as Neville Wheatley and Derek Francis did not seek re-election.

CHAIRMAN'S REPORT 2013

The Normandy Historians remain in good heart with the current membership now over 100. This is not surprising as more and more local people are taking a keen interest in their own village and surrounds, also in their own family history.

As you know 2 years ago Peter Blakiston had to give up Chairmanship after some 20 years for family health reasons. The Committee and Members then searched for a replacement but no one at that time was available to stand. As a result I agreed to act as temporary Chair for 2 years until a permanent one could be persuaded to take it on. My 2 years is now up but I am happy to stay on for a further year, subject to your agreement, when I will be over 83 years old. I then definitely will wish to retire. The Secretary, Diana, by that time will have served over 22 years and will likely be looking for a replacement with new ideas once a new Chair is in post. Any suggestions are always welcome. The rest of the small Committee are willing to put their names up for re-election.

The principal object of the Society continues to be to research the history of the village and this work is very much on-going by the Committee and other Members. Initially, researching members have concentrated on those aspects of the village that hitherto had been taken very much for granted such as Wanborough Station, Westwood Place, the Coussmaker Family, St Mark's Church, the Chapels, the Schools, Normandy Park, the Village Hall. The very important role that Henley Park and Vokes played in the lives of the inhabitants has been concentrated on this year.

Your Committee has previously researched and published three excellent books: Westwood House, Normandy Park, and A Century of Normandy in Surrey. Copies are still available as a Book or CD.

As well as keeping our finances in good order, John Squier has been deeply involved in the gigantic task of the research related to Henley Park and Vokes. The results are included in his publication "A History of Henley Park" which is now available on sale in a beautifully bound hard copy, at a very modest cost of £10. Copies can be obtained from John Squier, myself, or Diana the Secretary. I would highly recommend it to all Members and others as a really good read of great local historical interest. It also looks very impressive on the lounge table.



Other ongoing work by the Committee includes keeping records of Normandy in the press, scrapbook indexing, War Memorial biography and Property research, the photographing and listing of details of headstones in St Mark's old Churchyard and photo and Library indexing.

Jack Kinder our deputy Chair has extracted local historical information from the Manor of Cleygate documents, much of which is in Latin this and other transcriptions are sent to the Surrey Historic Centre in Woking for retention in their archives. Peter Trevaskis continues to search past copies of the local press. Christopher Pettitt is compiling details of every property in Normandy, Sandra is Membership Secretary and Ros gives great support to all our local projects. Peter Blakiston continues to give his valued support to website matters.

Our membership count is over 100 and attendance levels at our Open Meetings are consistently in the 40 to 50 region. We enjoy a stable financial position but have had to increase the annual subscription this year to £5, to meet the charges for good Speakers and the increasing cost of hiring the village hall for the Open Meetings.

The continuing success of Normandy Historians is due in no small way to your Executive Committee and the individual contributions made by former Members of the Committee, which is very much appreciated. Special thanks go to Ashley Hoare who runs our website with great efficiency. Members regularly use it and the statistics confirm many other interested "surfers". You are strongly recommended to log on to www.normandyhistorians.co.uk; there is a new password to enter the Members section.

We all look forward to a very full and interesting year ahead with the full support of all our Members and hope that some will feel able to volunteer their names for a short spell for the Chairmanship and the Committee. Otherwise the future of the Normandy Historians may well become somewhat limited after 2014, which would be a great pity as I am sure you all will agree.

Henley Park in Surrey The History of a Royal Manor

Henley Park in Surrey Henley Park's long history spans over a thousand years from Saxon settlement through royal ownership and more than one stately mansion to a wartime factory and its last-minute rescue from ruin and collapse. New research has revealed the much-debated location of the medieval royal complex as well as a long-forgotten Jacobean-style mansion that predates the Georgian-style mansion that we know today. This history is described in a readable and informative style in our new publication: *Henley Park in Surrey, the History of a Royal Manor*, by John Squier.

John is an amateur historian who has lived in Normandy for 38 years and was a founder member of Normandy Historians. He has spent many years researching Henley Park since he discovered that his house was briefly part of its extensive estates.

An updated history of Henley Park has long been overdue and with nearly 200 pages of text and 123 illustrations, many in colour, we believe that this is a book worthy of the long and fascinating history of Normandy's most prestigious estate.

A History of Normandy Park in Surrey is presented as an attractive, glossy soft-back book with cover photo, composed of 114 pages of text, 25 figures and 63 black & white photos featuring Normandy Park house, neighbouring houses and the people who helped to shape that area of Normandy including the author's family.

Jack Kinder, the author demonstrates a unique and succinct style of writing, which coupled with his skill as a draughtsman, so ably demonstrated in the copious figures in the book, will not disappoint the reader.

Notwithstanding the excellence of his work, *A History of Normandy Park in Surrey* is a veritable tome of reference for family history researchers and for those who have an interest in the transformation and development of a village as its large fruit farms and nurseries disappeared from the rural scene in the late 19th and early 20th Centuries.
