COMMITTEE REPORT FOR OUR 2025 AGM

Our 2024 AGM was held on 20th February. Also at this meeting Roy Wright gave an interesting talk about the Great Roof of Westminster Hall which was manufactured in Farnham.

In March our Treasurer John Squier gave a presentation on the London to Southampton Red Rover Stagecoach which ran through Normandy. This journey was recreated several times in the 1950s and 60s.

In April Louise Falcini, an academic at Sussex University, spoke on Sex and Parish Politics – about the lengths to which parish councils would go to avoid unmarried mothers becoming a burden on the parish. This talk illustrates the wealth of social history that exists in parish council records.

In May Julian Pooley of the Surrey History Centre gave a presentation on The Gentlemen's Magazine which provides a range of fascinating information, across a huge range of subjects, for local and family historians.

In September Peter Smith, a beekeeper and entomologist spoke to on Bees and Honey – Myth, Legend, Tradition and Magic, telling the story of the relationship between humans and bees which has lasted for millennia.

In October Susan Purcell, Fellow of the Chartered Institute of Linguists, spoke to us on the story behind the English Dictionary.

In November a film show presented by the Historians committee included extracts from the 1959 film "Light Up the Sky" shot in Normandy. Also presented were short films on the flora and fauna of Normandy Common, Guildford Past and Present, William Cobbett, the new Chester Bridge over the railway at Ash, and the Surrey History Centre.

The Historians rely on a very small number of active committee members to arrange our programme of annual meetings. One new member joined the committee in 2024 which did assist with this work but additional members are still urgently needed. If no other new members join the committee now or in the near future the existing committee regretfully confirm 2025 will be the last year that open meetings are held, and the Historians will in future exist only to carry out research on the history of the village, to maintain our web site, and to respond to enquiries about the history of the village from members of the public.

The committee wish to place on record it's grateful thanks to Ashley Hoare who single handedly maintains the Historians website to a very high standard.
